## A DEPUTY DIRECTOR TO JOIN THE MINISTRY TEAM AT CASA

Charting the future course for Casa is a continual process and is essential for ensuring its long-term well-being, growth, and development. We have long prayed and searched for a candidate to serve as Deputy Director of Casa. This Deputy Director would be trained and groomed until such time as they are prepared to assume the full Directorship role of overseeing and directing all the affairs of the Casa ministry.

**We are very pleased to announce** that Jose Villicaña will be joining our ministry team as Deputy Director beginning December 1st. Jose (Pepe) and Pamala, his wife of 12 years, along with their eight year old daughter Romina have been members of the Church of Christ Metropolitana in Mexico City for the last seven years. While serving at Metropolitana, Pamala headed the Children's Ministry and brings these very important skills and passions to Casa. Pepe served as an evangelist/administrator at Metropolitana while completing two years of study online at IBIT (Instituto Biblico Internacional de Texas) in Houston Texas. Prior to serving at the Church of Christ Metropolitana, Pepe gained extensive experience in manufacturing, plant management, and finance. We look forward to welcoming Pepe and his family to Casa, and fully expect that they will be an immeasurable blessing to the ministry.



## AN EVANGELIST TO JOIN THE CASA MINISTRY

**We will also be blessed** to have Osvaldo Martinez Sanchez joining our ministry team as the evangelist overseeing the Church in Anáhuac. Osvaldo will be joining us, along with his wife Edith and his two children Karla (16) and Oswaldo (11). The couple have been married for nineteen years and will be relocating from Mexico City. While completing his studies at IBIT (Instituto Biblico Internacional de Texas) in Houston Texas, Osvaldo has been serving as an evangelist and working with the Church of Christ Metropolitana in Mexico City for the last five years. Osvaldo and family are scheduled to begin their service January 1 and we have tentatively set a date of January 24th for our first worship service at the church in Anáhuac. And that is just the beginning!

For the last twenty-two years the name Casa de la Esperanza has become well known to the residents of Anáhuac. Over these many years, our children and visiting group members have distributed 113+ tons of food in twenty-pound bags containing rice, beans, and potatoes, as well as a bible to anyone needing one. We have also distributed an untold amount of clothing during this time and conducted numerous medical, dental and vision clinics –

thanks to the wonderful volunteers who come to Casa. These ministry activities, and more, have laid the groundwork to grow the church in Anáhuac. We believe that our neighbors will be open and receptive to hearing the gospel of Jesus Christ because of the relationships we have built with the community over the years.

As Osvaldo gets settled into his role of establishing contacts in the community and conducting individual and group bible studies, we will begin a schedule of streaming programs on subjects of general interest to the community as a means of drawing them to the building and further establishing relationships. These streaming programs would include topics such as diabetes, family relationships, indolence, marriage, etc. We will also seek to continue to organize medical, dental and eye glass clinics with the assistance and involvement of brethren in the US and in Mexico. As we work to carry out the Great Commission, our prayer is that the building the Lord has blessed us with will become a center for community involvement and a place where all who enter can experience the love of our Father.



# BAPTISMS

The daily devotionals, memory verses and scripture reading that the children participate in at Casa are some of the steppingstones that guide our kids towards baptism and discipleship of God the Father, His Son, and the Holy Spirit. During the daily devotionals our children study God's word, delving deeply into its meaning, while pausing regularly to raise their voices in song and praise to God our Father. Just as important as these daily routines is the teaching of God's Word by example. This example is demonstrated by the actions, words, deeds, and every Godly expression of love of each staff and ministry team member. The whole of these activities continues to bear fruit, and we are pleased to share that four of our children were recently baptized! The baptisms were done with all our children in attendance surrounding the baptistry, singing songs and united in prayer. While we continually endeavor to plant the seeds of truth, praise God who gives growth.

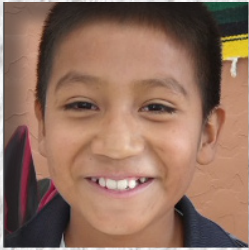

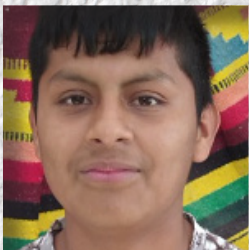

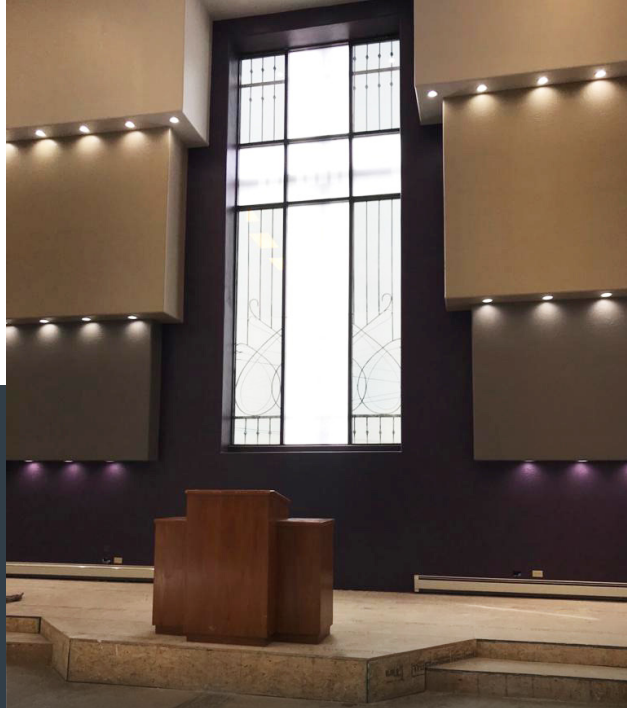


# ANNUAL REVIEWS

In September we had our annual review from DEF (the Mexican equivalent to our departments of social services agency). As we have in the past, Casa passed with flying colors. When our COVID-19 mitigating procedures were reviewed, they were found to be exemplary. We always do our best to assure the health and safety of our children and our staff. **Praise God,** all our children and staff are doing well.





We are working hard to complete the construction on the first and second floors of the church building. Our goal is to have these two floors complete before our first day of worship, which is tentatively scheduled for January 24, 2021.

## Construction Results

Construction progress continues in the new school/assembly wing, which also includes two infirmaries to isolate and care for children with infectious conditions, and a physician exam room. The physician exam room will house an examine table, a dental chair and related equipment, storage for medicines, supplies, and other medical equipment that are needed to care for the health of our children and members of the local community, as the need arises. We are in the final stages of installing sheet rock in the remaining 20% of the wing and estimate another two weeks to complete taping and the texturing of the walls. Once the church building is complete, our focus will shift to the completion of this wing. What remains on our final checklist is to install flooring, cabinets, and plumbing fixtures, and to paint the walls and trim. Our scheduled completion date for this wing is the end of February.
